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CROATIA

Geographical position:

Croatia extends from the furthest eastern edges of the Alps in the north-west to the Pannonian lowlands and the banks of the Danube in the east; its central region is covered by the Dinara mountain range, and its southern parts extend to the coast of the Adriatic Sea.

Surface:

The mainland covers 56,594 km2; surface area of territorial waters totals 31,067 km2.

Population:

4,437,460 inhabitants; composition of population: the majority of the population are Croats; national minorities are Serbs, Slovenes, Hungarians, Bosnians, Italians, Czechs and others.

System of government:

Multi-party parliamentary republic.

Capital:

Zagreb (779,145 inhabitants), the economic, traffic, cultural and academic centre of the country

Coastline:

5,835.3 km, of which 4,058 km comprise the coastlines of islands, solitary rocks and reefs. Number of islands, solitary rocks and reefs: 1,185; the largest islands are Cres and Krk; there are 47 inhabited islands.

Highest peak:

Dinara: 1,831 m above sea level.

Climate

Croatia has three climate zones; the prevailing climate in the country's interior is moderately rainy; on the highest peaks, a forest climate with snow falls, while the areas along the Adriatic coast have a pleasantly mild Mediterranean climate with a large number of sunny days; summers are dry and hot, winters mild and wet with significant precipitations. Average temperatures in the interior: January -2 to 0 oC, somewhat lower at the highest altitudes; August - about 20 oC and about 12 oC on the highest peaks. Average temperature in the littoral: January - 5 to 9 oC, August - 22 to 25 oC; sea temperature in winter: 2 oC; in summer, about 25 oC.

Currency:

Kuna (1 kuna = 100 lipa). Foreign currency can be exchanged in banks, exchange offices, post offices, travel agencies, hotels, camps, marinas; cheques can be cashed in banks.

DAY 3, Gornja Stubica

Breakfast. Departure to Museum of "SELJAČKA BUNA" (Peasant revolt) - Gornja Stubica (www.mdc.hr/msb/index.htm). Here is famous Stubica valley, memorial place of legendary Big Peasant revolt from 1573. year. The monument of revolt leader Matija Gubec, made by sculptor Antun Augustinčić, watches over the battle field from the picturesque hill above Gornja Stubica, next to Oršić castle. After the visit to Oršić castle accompanied by the custodian, the departure to rural household... Visit to the vineyards and wine cellars. Tasting of few types of local wines. Accommodation in hotel in Stubičke Toplice. Overnight.



DAY 5, Krapina

Breakfast. Departure to Krapina Neanderthal Museum which is situated in the centre of Krapina (www.mhz.hr/krapina.html). Krapina Neanderthal Museum is known as one of the most modern and most sophisticated museums in the world. Rich in newest technological achievements, with many visual and other sensations, brings the fascinating world of neanderthals. Enjoyment in reconstruction of cosmic evolution. Sightseeing of museum accompanied by expert lead. Return to Spa. Free time for personal activities. Bathing in Spa pools or stay in wellness centre. Possibility to organize a closed party for a group. Overnight.

Overnight.



DAY 6, Varaždin - Čakovec

Breakfast. Departure towards Varaždin. Sightseeing of old baroque town. Shorter free time for personal needs. Departure to castle Trakošćan situated in north - west part of Hrvatsko Zagorje (www.trakoscan.hr). The castle was made in 13 th century as a smaller fortress for the oversight of road from Ptuj to Bednjanska valley. Sightseeing accompanied by expert lead. Departure to Čakovec and visit of castle Zrinski-culturally historical monument zero category (www.mdc.hr/cakovec). Return to hotel. Overnight.



DAY 7, SpaBreakfast. Free time. Possibility of bathing in pools or wellness spa.




DAY 6. Poreč

Wide forest complexes, extraordinary beauty of lakes and falls, rich flora and fauna, fresh air, contrast of autumn colours, forest's paths and wooden bridges and plenty more are the part of unique unit which was proclaimed for World Natural Heritage by UNESCO in 1979., one of the first in the world. The water comes from many small rivers and brooks joined together by the cascades and falls. Departure to Zadar. Accommodation in hotel. Overnight



DAY 4, Zadar - Šibenik - NP Krka - Trogir

Breakfast. Sightseeing of town Zadar. Town rich with spiritual and material culture, town around Roman forum inside preserved walls with many sacral monuments (St. Donatus church-symbol of Zadar, Cathedral St. Stošija, St. Krševan church, St. Mary church) and museums. Departure to Šibenik, sightseeing of town - cathedral St. Jakov dating from 15 th century. Departure to National park Krka (www.npkrka.hr)- spaceous, mostly non changeable area of unique and multiple natural values. Beautiful falls of river Krka- natural and karstic phenomena. Skradinski buk is the longest barrier on the river and is one of the most famous natural beauties of Croatia. Accommodation in Trogir. Overnight.



Arrival to Zagreb, transfer to hotel, accommodation in hotel, overnight.

DAY 2, Zagreb - Plitvice

Breakfast. Sightseeing tour of town in the morning; main town square - Ban Josip Jelačić square, down Jurišićeva street, Kaptol, cathedral with the symbol fountain of Virgin Mar y and 4 angels, Gornji grad (Upper Town), Kamenita vrata (the Stone gate) - symbol of Zagreb, St. Mark's church, Croatian parliament, Klović Palace Museum, Lotrščak tower, Nikola Šubić Zrinski square, J.J.Strossmayer square (Art pavillion), King Tomislav square, Maršal Tito square (Croatian National Theatre, Mimara museum). Lunch, departure to Plitvice. Accommodation in hotel. Overnight.


















DAY 5, Trogir - Solin - SplitBreakfast. Sightseeing of town Trogir, small town situated west from Split, which is a part of world heritage and under



Day 2, BRIJUNI NATIONAL PARK

Brijuni Islands archiepelago, a necklace of islands and islets, is stretching one the west from the Istrian peninsula boasts of its luxuriant Mediterranean vegetation and rich submarine world. The allure of their beauty was equally strong in roman times, as testified to by the remains of Villa Rustica and a fortified castrum from Byzantine period. At the beginning of the 20 th century it became a park-like tourist area for European

aristocracy. In 1983 the Brijuni Archipelago was declared a national park and finally opened to visitors. We will tour the island of Veliki Brijun its amazing safari park inhabited by rare animals: zebras, antelopes, elephants, gazelles and llamas, the former summer residence of Josip Broz Tito visited by many world leaders at a time and numerous archeological sites.









Day 3, PULA

Transfer from hotel to Pula airport.



Itinerary 5

Roman heritage 4 days / 3 nights



Day 1, SPLIT Upon arrival at Split airport transfer to hotel, overnight in Split.





Sightseeing tour of Split including the Diocletian's Palace (305 A.D.) surrounded by walls with four gates, ancient basements, Peristyle, Jupiter Temple and Cathedral of St. Duimus with its bell tower. Time at leisure to explore on your own its narrow paved streets and palaces, City museum, Archaelogical museum or Vidović Gallery with permanent exhibition of the famous modern Croatian painter Emanuel Vidović (1870-1953).







Day 3, SOLIN & TROGIR

The excursion starts with the drive from Split to Solin followed by the visit to the Archaelogical Park of Salonae. We tour the Tusculum Museum, The Porta Caesarea, the Forum, baths, parts of the city walls, the Theatre and city necropolis with a sarcophagus. Solin developed on the location of ancient town of Salonaes which was the capital of the Roman province of Dalmatia and the birthplace of Emperor Diocletian. After the arrival of Avars and Slavs in the 7th century town was destroyed, and its refugees moved to settlement in and around Diocletian's palace, Spalatum (Split). After visit of Solin drive to Trogir, ancient Tragurion, fortified medieval town enrolled on the UNESCO's World Cultural Heritage. Explore on your own the Cathedral of St. Lawrence with famous main portal by Radovan, the most significant Romanesque piece of art in Dalmatia, the town Loggia and the Benedictine Monastery (founded in 1064.) where a Greek relief representing Kairols (the God of auspicios moments) is kept.

Itinerary 6

Zagreb city break 4 days / 3 nights



Day 3, ZAGREB-TRAKOŠĆAN CASTLE

Hrvatsko Zagorje, situated north from Zagreb, with its hills and vineyard, small wooden houses, medieval towns and castles is one of the most beautiful landscapes of Croatia. We drive to Trakošćan castle (13th century) situated on a small hill overlooking the large park and forest area. The castle changed the owners during the past, first were the Counts of Celje. In the 16th century king Maximilian gives the estate to Juraj Drašković as a token for given services. In the 19th century count Juraj V. Drašković turned it into his residential castle while the surrounding park with pond was modeled in the spirit of the German Romantic parks. Today castle Trakošćan with its Museum houses knights room, the hunting room, the music salon, specimens of fire arms dating from 15th-19th century and the studio of painter Julijana Erdody. Overnight at hotel in Zagreb.

Day 4, ZAGREB

Transfer from hotel to Zagreb airport.



Day 1, ZAGREB

Upon arrival at Zagreb airport, transfer to hotel for overnight.

Day 2, ZAGREB

Morning city tour of Zagreb includes the fortified, medieval Gornji grad (Upper town), church St. Mark's with its multicoloured tile roof, the baroque church St. Catherine, the Cathedral of St. Stephen, and the Parliament- Sabor. In the lower city, stretching around the main square with statue of Ban Jelačić, we will see the 19 th century National Theatre, Museum of Art and Crafts, the University, beautiful Zrinjevac Park with numerous delightful buildings-Art Nouveau. Afternoon for your leisure. Overnight at hotel in Zagreb



Day 2, SPLIT

City tour of Split including the Diocletian's Palace (305 A.D.) surrounded by walls with four gates, ancient basements, Peristyle, Jupiter Temple, and Cathedral of St. Duimus, with its bell tower. Time at leisure to explore on your own its narrow paved streets and palaces, City museum, Archaelogical museum or Vidović Gallery with permanent exhibition of the famous modern Croatian painter Emanuel Vidović (1870-1953).

Day 3, TROGIR, ŠIBENIK & KRKA WATERFALLS NATIONAL PARK Morning departure to Trogir, a fortified medieval town enrolled on the UNESCO's world Heritage. Explore on your the Cathedral of St. Lawrence with famous main portal by Radovan, the most significant Romanesque piece of art in Dalmatia, the town Loggia and the Benedictine Monastery (founded in 1064.) where a Greek relief representing Kairos (the God of auspicious moments) is kept. We continue to Šibenik, well known for the beautiful Cathedral of St. Jacob, the masterpiece of gothic-renaissance architecture enrolled on UNESCO'S world cultural heritage list. The tour continues through the karts Šibenik, hinterland to the Krka Waterfalls. Located in the lovely Krka National Park, the falls cascade over 17 natural barriers. permanent play of the sun and water crates a breathtaking scenery. There will be plenty time here for exploring or taking photographs of the scenic countryside.

Three UNESCO's cities 5 days / 4 nights



Upon arrival at Dubrovnik airport transfer to hotel, overnight in Dubrovnik.

Day 2, CITY TOUR OF DUBROVNIK

This morning we start our city tour from Pile Gate, with visit of the Onofrio's Fountaion, Francisan Monastery with the Old Pharmacy, Dominican Monastery, Church of St. Blaise - the city's patron saint, Rector's Palace and the Cathedral. Time a leisure to explore the maze of charming medieval back streets or relax at one of the street's many outdoor cafes. In the afternoon optional walk on the city walls or boat excursion to Lokrum.



Day 3, MONTENEGRO BLUE BAY OF KOTOR & BUDVA

Enjoy the breath taking view of the magnificent scenery of the Bay of Kotor, often compared to the Norwegian fiords. Drive along the bay, visit to the picturesque locality of Perast, and then take a small boat to reach the islet of "Gospa od Škrpjela" (Our Lady of the Rocks) with votive church of Our Lady. We proceed to Kotor, a medieval city classified as UNESCO's World Cultural Heritage surrounded by impressive walls and fortresses and dominated by the Romanesque Cathedral of St. Tryphon. Departure to Budva, short stop for the panoramic view of St. Stefan connected to the mainland by a bridge, once a fisherman village, converted today into a deluxe town-hotel. Orientation visit of Budva's picturesque old city laying on the small peninsula. Lunch in Budva. Time at leisure for swimming or exploring its numerous galleries, boutiques and cafes...



Day 4, MOSTAR

Morning departure to Mostar driving along the coast and then turning inland along the Neretva River Delta. Sightseeing tour of the Old city of Mostar recently (2005) included on the UNESCO's List of the World Cultural Heritage. During the Turkish rule, the city was an important trade centre, traces of that period are still visible today. We tour its elegant Bridge, Old colourful Bazaar, the Mosque and a typical Turkish house. On our way back we stop at Počitelj, a picturesque fortress- town perched on a hillside above the Neretva River.

Day 5, DUBROVNIK

Transfer from hotel to Dubrovnik airport

Istria terra magica 6 days / 5 nights



Day 3, OPATIJA- HUM- MOTOVUN- BERAM - POREČ

This morning we depart for Hum " the smallest town in the world" with its walls, town loggia on central square and town gate. Continuaton to Motovun, a picturesque mediaeval fortified town on the hilltop overlooking a dense chestnut wood. Departure for Beram to visit the church of St. Mary on Skriljine containing the most famous Croatian Gothic frescoes (Dance Macabre) work of the local painter Vincent of UNESCO's List of the World Cultural Monuments. Overnight in Poreč.



Day 1, ZAGREB

Upon arrival at Zagreb airport, transfer to hotel for overnight.

Day 2, ZAGREB-OPATIJA

Morning city tour of Zagreb including the fortified mediaval Upper Town, St. Mark's church, the Cathedral of St. Stephen, the Stone Gate, the Croatian National Theatre and the University. Afternoon drive to Opatija, once the resort of choice for the Habsburgs and European Royalty as well as personalities from the world of culture such as Gustav Mahler, Isidora Duncan and A.P. Chekhov. Overnight in Opatija.









Day 5, POREČ- SV. PETAR U ŠUMI - PAZIN - ZAGREB


Departure to Pauline Monastery of St. Peter in the Woods (sv. Petar u šumi), founded by Benedictines in the 12th century that use to be the cultural center of this part of Istria. We continue to Pazin, situated in the very heart of Istria, for a visit to the church of St. Nicolas housing the remarkable frescoes painitnigs (15th c). We will enjoy the view on the impressive Pazin Cave and Castle, the best preserved mediaeval fortress of Istria, where Jules Verne set a large part of the plot of his novel Mathias Sandorf. Departure to Zagreb and overnight.

Day 6, ZAGREB

After breakfast, departure transfer to Zagreb airport.

Day 4, POREČ- PULA- BRIJIUNI ISLANDS National Park-ROVINJ- POREČ

Morning departure for Pula. Sightseeing tour of Pula including a visit to the Arena (1stcentury AD) one of the best preserved Roman amphitheatres in the world, Triumphal Arch of Sergius Temple of Augustus and Gate of Hercules. We continue to the National Park of Brijuni Islands abounding in luxuriant subtropical vegetation and wildlife, with numerous archaelogical sites, consisting of 14 islands and islets of which we tour Veliki Brijun Island. Continuation to Rovinj, the most picturesque town of Istria, we walk through its narrow cobbled streets up to the church of St. Euphemia. Return to Poreč for overnight.

Day 2, ZAGREB-PLITVICE LAKES

Breakfast. Morning departure for Plitvice Lakes, National Park on UNESCO's List of World Natural Heritage. Sixteen lakes, each at the different level, joined in a series of cascading waterfalls. Surrounded by dense wood Plitvice Lakes are a natural phenomenon of a rare and unique beauty. Dinner and overnight in Plitvice.





Day 4, SPLIT - DUBROVNIK

Breakfast. Departure for Mostar. Sightseeing tour of the city where the canyon of the river Neretva passes throught the city center. City is famous for its preserved Old bridge which is one of the more picturesque buildings in this part of the Europe and the only one of its kind in the world, almost 500 years old. The old city core has been build around the Old bridge and that part of the city, as well as the bridge, are under UNESCO protection. After the tour we depart towards Sarajevo. Check in at the hotel; dinner, overnight.

Day 6, SARAJEVO - ZAGREB

Breakfast. Morning city tour of Sarajevo including Baščaršija, Gazi Husref Bey Mosque and Tunnel War Museum. After the tour we depart towards to Zagreb. Check in at the hotel, dinner. Overnight.

Pannonian arts & landscapes 8 days / 7 nights





Day 3, VARAŽDIN-HLEBINE-ORAHOVICA

The beautiful Baroque city of Varaždin was declared in 1209. a free royal city by Hungarian Croatian king Andrew II and later on became the the former capital of Croatia. Morning city tour includes the medieval city center with the old Fortress housing the Town museum and the old baroque cemetery of Varaždin. Departure to Hlebine, the cradle of the Croatian naive painting for a visit to the Gallery of Naive Art and the Gallery of Ivan Generalić, famous Croatian naive painter. Continuation to Orahovica visiting en route the typical Podravina house and ethno museum of family Camba in Djurđevac. Dinner and overnight in Orahovica.

Day 4, Orahovica- Papuk Nature Park - Kutjevo Castle - Osijek

Visit to Papuk Nature Park known for its beautiful forest, landscapes and protected geological monuments being known as the oldest mountain in Croatia. We continue to Kutjevo where we tour the famous castle of Kutjevo with its famous wine cellars dating from1232., wine tasting. We proceed to Osijek to the largest city of Slavonia. Sightseeing of Osijek includes the old Gornji grad with the church. Dinner at a typical restaurant and overnight in Osijek.







Day 1, ZAGREB

Upon arrival at Zagreb airport, transfer to hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 2, ZAGREB-HRVATSKO ZAGORJE CASTLES- VARAŽDIN

Morning sightseeing tour of Zagreb including the fortified Upper Town, St. Mark's church with its multicolored roof and the Cathedral. Departure to Hrvatsko Zagorje, visit to Kumrovec, ethno village with is traditional wooden houses and old crafts. Continuation to Trakošćan Castel (13 th c) with its tower surrounded by romantic park. We proceed to Oršić, one the most beautiful Baroque castle of Hrvatsko Zagorje with its Museum of Peasant's Revolt that occurred in 1573. Continuation to Varaždin, dinner and overnight.









Day 7, ZAGREB- PLITVICE LAKES NATIONAL PARK
Morning departure to Plitvice Lakes National Park
included on the UNESCO's List of World Natural
Heritage. We tour the park of a rare beauty with its
sixteen lakes, each at a different level, connected in a
series of cascading waterfalls and surrounded by dense
wood. Return to Zagreb for ovenight.

Day 8, ZAGREB After breakfast departure and transfer to Zagreb airport.



Day 5, OSIJEK- KOPAČKI RIT PARK OF NATURE AND VUKOVAR

Morning boat ride and walking tour of Kopački rit, one of the largest marshlands in Europe known for the richest habitat of the red deer. Around 260 various birds species nest here and many others use it as temporary shelter on their migration rutes. We proceed to Vukovar, the city that was heavily damaged and well known for its defense during the Croatian Independence War. Sightseeing tour includes visit to the City Museum of Vukovar (in the Eltz Manor) the Baroque city center and the cemetery. Return to Osijek for overnight.



Day 6, OSIJEK-DJAKOVO-VRPOLJE MEŠTROVIĆ GALLERY - ZAGREB

Departure to Djakovo for a visit to the Cathedral of St. Peter. We proceed to the famous Djakovo stud farm of Lipizzaner horses that has a 500 years long tradition in breeding horses. Setting off to Vrpolje for a visit of the Gallery of Ivan Meštrović, the greatest Croatia sculptor. Departure to Zagreb stopping en route in Lonjsko polje nature Park for a visit of Krapje with a typical village architecture. Dinner and overnight in Zagreb.







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Itinerary 12

Wine & gourmet tour 8 days / 7 nights





Day 2, ZAGREB- KUMROVEC EXCURSION

Full day trip to the picturesque Hrvatsko zagorje region stretching northwards of Zagreb, with its rolling hills and vineyards, old wooden houses and castles. Visit to the gallery of the Croatian sculptor Augustinčić, and the open air ethno village of Kumrovec. For lunch, we will taste roast pork with sauteed potatoes and excellent corn bread baked in the baker's oven accompanied by the Frankovka wine from the Moslavina region, with poppy seed strudel for dessert. Frankovka wine: ruby colour wine with light aroma, harmoniously balanced. Return to Zagreb, followed by dinner at a local

restaurant. We will taste a delicious dish turkey with broad home- made noodles and lločka Graševina white wine. lločka Graševina greenish to bright yellow colour, fresh taste, special aroma.

Day 3, ZAGREB-SAMOBOR-OPATIJA

Morning sightseeing of Zagreb, the capital of Croatia (the Upper Town, St. Mark's church, the Cathedral). Leave for Samobor, a picturesque town where we will have lunch at a famous restaurant which preserves the tradition of the ancient Croatian dishes: "štrukli" soup, fillet Zagreb style with the Pinot from Žumberak, the hilly region in the Samobor area. Crni Pinot: light ruby, pleasant aroma and slightly rough-to-taste. Continue to Opatija, an elegant destination, once the favorite resort of choice for the Habsburgs and

European Royalty. Dinner a restaurant in Lovran on a seaside terrace: a selection of fresh grilled fish with the Malvazia wine from Pazin, Istria. Pazinska Malvazija:



Day 1, ZAGREB

Transfer from Zagreb airport to hotel. Welcome dinner in a typical local restaurant. Authentic dishes from the Zagreb area are known as "burghers cuisine", the sediment of the Austro-Hungarian cultural heritage. We will taste its delicious Zagorje style štrukli-pastry stuffed with fresh cottage cheese, gilled duck with apple and red wine sauce accompanied by the excellent Istrian wine Merlot, and apple strudel for dessert. Istrian Merlot: red dry wine with a light raspberry flavour and dark ruby colour. Overnight in Zagreb.









Day 5, ZADAR-MURTER-THE KRKA FALLS-SPLIT

Sightseeing of Zadar, including the Cathedral of St. Anastasia, St. Donatus Church- the masterpiece of Romanesque architecture- and the Roman Forum from the 2nd century B.C. Leave for the island of Murter where we will have grilled scampi and excellent fish stew, brudet, with polenta made from white mazie, accompanied by the Žlahtina wine from Vrbnik on the island of Krk, and caramel cream for dessert. Žlahtina: yellowish to bright green colour with fruity flavour, pleasant aroma. Leave for the Krka Waterfalls National Park continue to Split, stopping enroute in Trogir, a lovely medieval town dominated by the Cathedral of St. Lawrence, with its famous Romanesque Portal, the Town Loggia and Renaissance palaces. Dinner with sea food specialties at the local restaurant. Overnight in Split.



Day 7, DUBROVNIK- KONAVLE AND CAVTAT ECXURSION

Morning city tour of Dubrovnik including the Franciscan monastery with the Old Pharmacy, St. Blaise's church, the Cathedral, the Rector's Palace... Leave for the excursion to the region of Konavle and lunch at the Konavoski Dvori restaurant where we will taste its excellent smoked ham and cheese, baked veal under the iron bell covered with hot coals, with the excellent wine Plavac Konavle, and the local nut cake. Plavac Konavle: intensive red ruby wine with aromatic flavour of blueberry. Visit to Cavtat, a picturesque town with charming cobble stone streets, churches and the Franciscan monastery, situated on the site of the ancient Greek and Roman settlement of Epidaurum. Return to Dubrovnik. Farewell dinner at the restaurant including lobster salad, grilled stuffed squids, boiled fish served with the Maraština wine. Dubrovačka Maraština: bright semi - dry wine, apricot and peach flavour, harmonious and drinkable. Overnight in Dubrovnik.

Day 8, DUBROVNIK

Morning transfer to Dubrovnik airport.

Day 4, OPATIJA-PAG-ZADAR

Leave for the island of Pag, famous for its lamb meat and famous Pag cheese of an exquisite taste coming from the quality of grazing aromatic herbs in the vicinity of the sea. Enjoy the lunch at Pag served with the Plavac wine at a typical local restaurant. The Pag area is also famous for its long tradition of lace making: we will visit the lace- makers and learn about lace-making. Plavac: dark ruby colour with pleasant dark fruit aroma. Continue to Zadar, located in the very centre of the Croatian Adriatic in the vicinity of the most indented Adriatic archipelago, the Kornati Islands. Dinner at a local restaurant with grilled tuna steak. Overnight in Zadar.







Day 6. SPLIT-STON-DUBROVNIK

Sightseeing of Split, including the visit to the Diocletian's Palace with its cellars and gates, St. Duimus church, the Peristyle and Jupiter's Temple. For lunch we will taste a typical Dalmatian dish-pasticada-roast beef marinated in white vinegar, flavoured with different herbs, and dumplings. Depart for Dubrovnik. Dinner at Ston, well known for its oysters of outstanding quality. We will taste "black risotto" (catle-fish and shell-fish), the Korčula Pošip wine, and a very old local dessert-the Ston macaroni cake. Pošip Čara: bright yellow colour, specific aroma and harmoniously balanced. Setting off to Dubrovnik. Overnight in Dubrovnik.

The old city centre has a unique architectural appearance, particularly due to its mixture of Baroque and Art Nouveau architecture with masterful creations by the 20 th century architect Jože Plečnik. The tour ends with a funicular ride to Ljubljana Castle, which departs from the Krek square. After city tour, continuation to Plitvice Lakes. Largest national park in Croatia, with 16 lakes and waterfalls surrounded by dense woods. Arrival at Plitvice in the late afternoon. Touring of the Plitvice Lakes National Park. Dinner in hotel. Overnight.



Day 5, DUBROVNIK

Sightseeing tour of Dubrovnik including the Franciscan and Dominican monasteries, the Rector's Palace and the Cathedral. We will tour the city walls with their magnificent fortresses and towers. Afternoon time for your leisure. Dinner. Overnight.









Day 6, DUBROVNIK- MOSTAR- SARAJEVO

Morning departure to Mostar driving along the coast and then turning inland along the Neretva River Delta. Sightseeing tour of the Old city of Mostar recently (2005) included on the UNESCO's List of the World Cultural Heritage. During the Turkish rule, the city was an important trade centre, traces of that period are still visible today. Day 7, SARAJEVO - BEOGRAD

Morning city tour of Sarajevo including Baščaršia, Gazi Husref Bey Mosque and Tunnel War Museum. After the tour we depart towards Beograd, the capital of Serbia. Sightseeing tour of Beograd, lying at the confluece of the Danube and Sava rivers, including Kalemegdan with its fortress and a beautiful view on the confluence. Overnight.





Day 8, BEOGRAD - ZAGREB

Morning departure to Zagreb. Upon arrival city tour of Zagreb, including the fortified medieval Upper Town, St. Mark's church, the Cathedral of St. Stephen, the Stone Gate, the Croatian National Theatre and the University. Free time in the evening. Overnight.

Day 1, ZAGREB

Upon arrival at Zagreb airport, transfer to hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 2, ZAGREB - OPATIJA

Breakfast. Transfer to Opatija. Meeting at the hotel in Opatija. Enjoy a stroll throught this elegant seaside resort with old villas and hotels, beautiful parks and gardens with magnolia trees and camellias. Getting together all participants. You will meet your tour guide and get all necessary information. Dinner. Overnight in hotel in Opatija.



Day 3, NORTH VELEBIT NATIONAL PARK

Breakfast. Morning drive to Krasno - small mountain village, well known pilgrimage place of Our Lady of Krasno. Hiking from Krasno across the green and wooded slopes to the village of Kutarevo, famous for its wooden carved products, and excellent cheese. Kuterevo is also known as a shelter for the young bears who could not survive otherwise in the wilderness of Velebit. Visit to the bear shelter and local farms where a wooden souvenir, a useful dish or a tool can be bought. We will continue to Otočac by van visiting enroute the village of Sinac. Situated at the sping of the River Gacka, this picturesque village is protected by UNESCO as an International Biosphere Preserve. Overnight in hotel in Opatija. Ascent: 180 m (Climb). Descent: 190 m. Hiking: 4 hrs.





Day 4, RISNJAK NATIONAL PARK

The Risnjak National Park is the only habitat of the big lynx , the biggest European wild cat, in this part of Europe. The Risnjak Mountain as well as the National Park of Risnjak are named after the big lynk (ris in Croatian). We will hike throught the forest of thick and high beech and fir-tree up to the peak of Risnjak (1523 m), which offers a breath-taking view of the Gorski Kotar, Kvarner islands and Istrian Peninsula, and even parts of Slovenia. We will descend its wonderful green slopes to the place called Crni Lug, where our van will be waiting for us. The abundance of vegetation and the well preserved eco-system make Risnjak one of the most unique national parks in the world. Overnight in hotel in Opatija. Ascent: 373 m. Desecent: 750 m. Hiking: 4,30 hrs.

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Day 5, PLITVICE LAKES NATIONAL PARK

Another beautiful day in the kingdom of greenery and abundance of water. We will drive to the Plitvice Lakes National Park classiffied UNESCO's Natural Heritage in 1979. We start touring the lakes by a small train that will take us up to the Upper Lakes (Gornja Jezera). We will hike from there along the numerous cascades and waterfalls with limestone barriers to Lake Kozjak. A Park's boat will take us to Lower Lakes (Donja Jezera), where we will continue our stroll around, above and below waterfalls. At the end of the hike, we take a break under the high beech trees, enjoy the silence and freshness of the air. Overnight in hotel in Starigrad. Ascent:000. Descent:150 m. Hiking: 4hrs.



Day 7, KRKA NATIONAL PARK

Morning drive to the village of Brnjica on the plateau of the Čikola River Canyon. We will continue on foot to the canyon dominated by the impressive fortress Ključica from 1330. Visit to the Fortress followed by a hike to the mouths of the Čikola and Krka rivers. We hike along the extremely steep and picturesque canyon up to Torak, a round lake where we will take a short break. Follow the canyon's edge and enjoy the view of the Čikola's mouth where she flows into the Krka river. Arrival at the village of Goris where our van will be waiting for us. Drive to Skradinski Buk waterfall in the Krka River National Park famous for its beauty all over the world. Return to the hotel. Overnight in hotel in Starigrad. Ascent: 166m. Descent: 184 m. Hiking: 4,30 hrs.





Day 6, PAKLENICA NATIONAL PARK

We will drive to Starigrad near Paklenica. We hike among impressive rocks of the magnificent canyon of Velika Paklenica, one of the most famous alpinists climbing sites in this part of Europe. Accompanied by the murmur of the Paklenica spring, we reach the area of Anića Kuk and further uphill to the famous cave Manita Peć. Visit to the interior of the cave. We continue to Lugarnica for a visit to its recounstructed mills built in the characteristic "Paklenica" style. Overnight in hotel in Starigrad. Ascent: 490 m. Descent: 490 m. Hiking: 5,30 hrs.



Day 8, KORNATI NATIONAL PARK

Morning departure to Zadar, where we will embark on a wooden old timer boat that will take us to the kingdom of the Kornati Archipelago. Lunch in the Mir Bay followed by a walk to the salt lake Mir. We explore its banks and climb to the cliffs. Enjoy the view of the glittering sea with a row of islands and islets. Return to Zadar in the late afternoon. Overnight in hotel in Starigrad. Ascent: 70m. Descent:70m. Hiking: 2 hrs.

Day 9, DEPARTURETransfer to Zagreb airport for your return flight.

Day 2, ZAGREB-OPATIJA



Morning city tour of the Diocletian's Palace (3rd century A.D.) includes the Peristyle, the Cathedral of St. Domnius (Sv. Duje) and Jupiter's Temple. Departure for Dubrovnik. Overnight in Dubrovnik.



Day 8, DUBROVNIK

Sightseeing tour of Dubrovnik including the Franciscan and Dominican monasteries, the Rector's Palace and the Cathedral. In the afternoon, we will tour the city walls with their magnificient fortresses and towers. Overnight in Dubrovnik.

Day 9, DUBROVNIK- MLJET ISLAND National Park

Full day excursion to the island of Mljet, covered by dense pine woods. Its two salty lakes are connected by a narrow channel. In the middle of the Great Lake there is an islet with an old Benedictine Monastery. Overnight in Dubrovnik.





Day 6, KRKA Waterfalls National Park- ŠIBENIK- TROGIR-SPLIT

Morning departure for the Krka Waterfalls National Park. Touring of the waterfalls and a boat ride to the islet of Visovac for a visit to the Franciscan Monastery. Continuation of our drive to Šibenik, visit to the Cathedral of St. Jacob (15th century) a masterpiece of the Gothic-Renaissance art. We proceed towards Trogir, a picturesque medieval town, including a visit to the Cathedral of St. Lawrence with its magnificent Romanesque portal. Overnight in Split.







Day 10, DUBROVNIK




Day 3, OPATIJA -PULA-POREČ

On our way to Pula, we stop at the Archelogical park of Nesactium (remain of a prehistoric and Roman town). A city tour of Pula including a visit to the Roman Amphitheatre, Temple of Augustus, Triumphal Arch of Sergius, Gate of Hercules, Basilica of St. Maria Formosa(6thc), Cathedralandthe Archelogial Museum of Istria. Continuantion to Poreč, for a visit to the 6th c. Euphrasius Basilica, classified as UNESCO's World Cultural Monument. Return to Opatija for overnight.









Day 1, ZAGREB

Upon arrival at Zagreb airport, transfer to hotel overnight.

Day 2, ZAGREB- OPATIJA

Morning sightseeing tour of Zagreb including the fortified Upper Town, St. Mark's Church, the Stone Gate, the Cathedral and the Croatian Archelogical Museumhousingprehistoric Greek, Romanand Mediaeval collection, the Lapidarium and a large numismatic collection. The Egyptian collection includes the famous Zagreb Mummy with the longest Etruscan inscription on the linen wrappin "the Etruscan Linen Book of Zagreb". Departure for Opatija for overnight.





Day 4, OPATIJA

Morning departure for Senj for a visit to its Cathedral and the 16th c renaissance fortress of Nehaj. Continuation to Rab, a mediavel city dominated by four bell towers (ferry from Jablanac to Mišnjak). City tour of Rab including a visit to the Lapidarium and the 12 th c. Romanesque Cathedral of the Mary's Assumption with its Great Bell Tower. In 2006. the Cathedral received the hightest EU prize Europa Nostra for comeprehensive research and skillfull restoration of cultural heritage. Return with the same ferry and continuation to Zadar. Overnight in Zadar.

Day 5, ZADAR AND NIN

Morning city tour of Zadar including the Roman Forum 81st c BC). St. Donatus Church, the most famous early mediavel monument (9th c), the Cathedral of St. Anastasia, Archelogical Museum and the permanent, exhibition "The Gold and Silver of Zadar" in the Museum of the Benedictine Monastery. Afternoon drive to Nin, the seat of the fist Croatian prince Višeslav (8th c) and later on of the first Croatian bishop. Here we visit two churhces of unique pre Romanesque architecture, the church of the Holy cross (9th c) and St. Nicola's church (11th c). Return for overnight in Zadar.



Day 7, SPLIT - SOLIN

Morning city tour of Split covering the Diocletian's Palace listed as UNESCO's World Cultural Heritage with the Peristyle, Jupiter's Temple and the Cathedral. Visit to the Museum of Croatian Archelological Monuments. Afternoon departure for Solin, visit to the Archelogical park with remains of the ancient Salona, the seat of the Roman province of Dalmatia. We visit the Tusculum Museum and tour the Porta Caesarea, the Forum, baths, parts of city walls, the Theatre and city necropolis with a sarcophagus. Return to Split for overnight.

Croatian Archeological Museum, Zagreb Arcehological Park of Nesactium, near Pula Archeologica Museum of Istria

Day 6, ZADAR- ŠIBENIK-TROGIR-SPLIT

Departure for Šibenik for a visit of its renaissance of Cathedral of St. Jacob, included in the UNESCO's List of World Cultural Monuments, and the City Museum followed by a panoramic view from the town's oldest fortress of St. Ann. Continuation for Trogir, a picturesque mediaeval town included in the UNESCO's List of World Cultural Heritage. Visit to St. Lawrence Cathedral with its famous Romanesque portal dating from 13th c, the Benedictine church and monastery of St. Nicola's housing the relief of Kairos, and the pre Romanesque church of St. Barbara (9 th c.). Arrival in Split for overnight.




Day 8, SPLIT- NARONA- TRSTENO - DUBROVNIK

Morning departure for Metković and Vid, the ancient settlement of Narona, once an important Roman trade and political center. Visit to the archelogical park including the segments of the city walls, of the Forum with mosaics, the church of St. Vitus with the Baptistery, and the new Archeological Museum built on the site of the Temle of Augusts presenting 15 sculptures of the emperor, family members, Roman dignitaries and deities. The biggest ship in the world -Slavonski Brod / 1 day



After this there is time for sightseeing of Town library and walk at Korzo towards river Sava. Visit to birth house of Ivana Brlić Mažuranić, famous fairy tale and short stories for children writer, who wrote her most beautiful stories for children there, and also visit to gallery Ivana Brlić Mažuranić. We will walk along the coast of river Sava to Franciscan monestry and church of Holly Trinity-building from 18 th century, one of the most beautiful sacral objects in Croatia, shorter sightseeing by the escort of monk. After that we will go to etno garden Crlien.



After the lunch we continue our trip towards ZOO of family Milec in Rušćica which is home for about 70 kinds of birds and animals. You can see there, apart from domestic animals, a bear, tigar, eagle, monkey Bobo and other magnificent animal and bird world speciments.



Arrival to Slavonski Brod in early morning hours, meeting with the tour guide. After that there is time for sightseeing of Brod fortress-unique monumental example of army architecture from 18 th century which was built by Austria as big emperor and royal frontier region fortress for the defence from Turks. We will visit Gallery Ružić with first permanent set up of modern Croatian art from the second part of 20 th century, watch projection of 8-minute tourist film "It was once in fortress Brod in 18 th century". By sightseeing of "Tambura museum" and sightseeing of costumed dolls of frontier soldiers in their natural size, our visit to fortress finishes.





House estates from the end of 18 th century and beginning of 19 th century give us the typical example of Slavonian peasant household from that period so they can see barn, stable, pigsty, henhouse, ovens, black smith and wheelwright workshops. As a part of so called Bećarska house whose major part is in function of providing catering services, on 50m2 there is museum area with many characteristic objects for those days households, like equipment for weaving or pots and equipment for making bread. After the sightseeing tour there is time for lunch.







The Plavac Mali grape variety thrives remarkably well in such sunny Karst soil and this is where the king of Croatian red wines, Dingač, dwells. The ancient wine culture of Croatia is the origin of the most famous American grape, the Zinfandel. Here is your chance to taste a top quality original.

DAY 2, Dubrovnik - peninsula Pelješac - Dubrovnik


Breakfast. Taking a cable car and clime to hill above the Dubrovnik. Spectacular view of old town and surrounding area take your breath Return to old city. Proceeding our trip in direction of peninsula Pelješac. Short stop at Ston. Ston was a major fort of the Ragusan Republic whose defensive walls were regarded as a notable feat of medieval architecture. The town's inner wall measures 890 metres in length, while the Great Wall outside the town has a circumference of 5 km. The walls extend to Mali Ston, a smaller town on the northern side of the Peliešac isthmus and the end of the Bay of Mali Ston, notable for its mariculture. Ston is also known for its saltworks which were run by the Republic of Ragusa and the Ottoman Empire. Lunch. Setting-off to vinery.



First stop at Winery Vinifera at small place Ponikve. Grape and wine production in Ponikve on the Pelješac peninsula has been a Miloš family tradition for generations. We base our production on the autochthonous grape variety of Plavac Mali. In hues the colours pour through the glass of reflecting shades in motion. In their layers they speak narrate, whisper of time of hardship. Down the glass rims tender and slow tears arise as if from a different world they derive, slowly they descend, slide, closing the circle, talking.

Next stop is Winery Grgić. Grgić wines was established in 1996. by legendary Napa Valley winemaker, Croatian-born Miljenko "Mike" Grgich, his daughter, Violet Grgić and his nephew Ivo Jeramaz. Dedicated to the art of winemaking, Mike started the winery to produce the finest wines from native Dalmatian grapes, and he concentrates on crafting Croatia's very best varietals: Plavac Mali (red wine) and Pošip (white wine). The winery is located in Trstenik on the Pelješac peninsula, with a stunning view over the Mediterranean Sea, north of the historic walls of the port of Dubrovnik, in the Southern wine region of Croatia. Although Miljenko has received many gold medals and the highest possible accolades for his

California-made-wines, those dearest and most meaningful to him are the ones he received for his Pošip and Plavac Mali in Croatia





Our last stop of this day is Saints Hills Winery. Croatia at the heart of Europe, at the heart of the

Mediterranean. The Adriatic Sea and our Saints Hills' vineyards is a stone thrown away from Dubrovnik, and two from Diocletian's Palace in Split and Vespasian's Amphitheatre in Pula. Here we celebrate the sea and the sun, Istria and Dalmatia, the Bora and the Sirocco, the stone and the vine. And through this little window in our house, amid the Dingač vineyards, you can see the millennial path of the holy liquid wine, from the Greek amphorae that carried it through the canal, to the wooden trabaccoli that carried it to Split. Following a path both sides of the Pelješac peninsula, all the way to Istria, we set forth in search of perfection.


Dingač. The first place in Croatia to be recognised in 1961., as an appellation with "Protected Geographical Origin". The autochthonous variety Plavac Mali has been producing the best wines for centuries. From our vineyards you can view the island of Mljet, and you can sense Dubrovnik close by, with the deep blue sea on the horizon, undulating all the way to Italy. It is as if you are observing the path that Plavac Mali's "ancestor" had traversed, coming to Italy as Primitivo, only to set forth over the Atlantic to become Zinfandel. Dingač has its own particular path, carved through the mountain by the winegrowers, linking the vineyards to the port of Trstenik. From here, the first wines left for Europe. Dingač has always been the authentic heart of Croatian winemaking. St. Lucia, authentic Dingač.

ISLAND KORČULA

Rich in vineyards, olive groves and small villages, and harbouring a glorious old town, the island of Korčula is the sixth-largest Adriatic island stretching nearly 47km in length. The dense woods led the original Greek settlers to call the island Korkyra Melaina (Black Korčula). Quiet coves and small sandy beaches dot the steep southern coast while the northern shore is flatter and more pebbly. Tradition is alive and kicking on Korčula, with age-old religious ceremonies, folk music and dances still being performed to an ever-growing influx of tourists. Oenophiles will adore sampling its wine. Arguably the best of all Croatian whites is produced from pošip grapes, which are only grown here and to a lesser extent on the Pelješac peninsula. The grk grape, cultivated around Lumbarda, also produces quality dry white wine.



DAY 3, Dubrovnik - Island Korčula - Dubrovnik

Breakfast. Start our trip in direction of Island Korčula. First stop is Winery Korta Katarina. The Korta Katarina (KK) Southern Croatian winery and its villa "Rivijera Orebić" are a wine lover's dream. The first venue of its kind in Southern Croatia, the winery, villa and vineyards are perched on the edge of the crystal-clear Adriatic sea and provide breathtaking views of Croatia's Dalmatian Coast. Considered one of the most stunning coastlines in the world, the Dalmatian Coasts Dingač and Postup regions of the Pelješac peninsula and the region of Cara, on the Island of Korčula, produce Korta Katarina's award winning Plavac Mali, Reuben's Reserve Plavac Mali, Pošip and Rose wines. The Korta Katarina estate is located in the small coastal town of Orebić, a region renowned for its culture, seaports and wine making traditions that date back to the Roman Empire. For centuries, 'kortas' were the center of family gatherings for sea captains and sailors embarking on worldly adventures. After the wine testing we proceed to Island Korčula by ferry. Korčula island - born place of famous sailor and explorer Marco Polo invites people to explore born place of this famous sailor. Visit Marco Polo museum and born house of MarcoPolo.Lunch.ProceedingourtriptoWineryZureatLumbarda.




Famous wine of Lumbarda and one of the synonyms of this beautiful Dalmatian village! There is probably no wine lover or connoisseur in Croatia who doesn't know where this unique white wine comes from and where it is mostly cultivated. However, it is also interesting to know that among all the wine specialists, there is still no sound agreement whether this particular three vowel name come from this wine's taste, the origins of the first grapes brought to Lumbarda, or eventually from both of those elements that tell us already much about Grk wine itself. Grk as bitter, and Grk as Greek(s) who were the first known to produce wine on this part of Korčula island. Therefore, keeping in mind that tradition of wine making in this region started with Greek colonies a few centuries BC and that inhabitants of Lumbarda from the early beginning, as Croatians in general, also have very long tradition in wine making it would than be a huge mistake to place Croatia on the map of the "New World" wine countries. Long tradition was however put in danger at the beginning of 20 th century and production was seriously affected, like in the most part of Europe, by the attack of little pest known as phylloxera. Luckily for one part of Lumbarda's vineyards, phylloxera proved to be less harmful and this mainly goes for the grapes planted in sandy soil in central part of the village. However some of the vineyards on southern slopes of Korčula island, with almost perfect condition for wine making, perished the most and were abandoned for decades. Today the situation is changing in a good way and the very suitable land for the wine making that was forgotten for more than a half of a century, is getting in focus again. Southern slopes of Korčula island will very probably give again what Grk likes the most: excellent soil, a lot of sun and temperature stability under the influence of the nearby sea.







Last stop of our wine tour is Winery Toreta at Smokvica village. This vinery offers high-quality indigenous wines Pošip and Rukatac and dessert wine Prosecco. In addition to wine tasting and traditional dishes you can visit the traditionally regulated area an enviable collection of equipment for viticulture and wine. Return to Dubrovnik. Dinner. Overnight.





DAY 4, Dubrovnik - Split

Breakfast. Starting our trip in direction of Split. Short stop at Neum - small town at Bosnia and Herzegovina. Split. to Sightseeing Setting-off - the biggest town of Croatian coast. 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


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GRK WINE

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Next stop is at Winery Vipava 1894. Vipava valley. Between the Karst and the Trnovo forest spreads wide Vipava Valley, known for its mild climate and rich soil composition (marl), which gives the local wines gentle, elegant and quite persistent bouquet. The tastes of wines are harmonious, elegant, delicate, fruit pleasing with low alcohol. The valley is planted with over 2300 hectares of vineyards. Here are the naturally given, ideal conditions for the growth of the following grape varieties: Ribolla, Riesling, Chardonnay, Sauvignon, Green, Pinot Gris, Muscat, Malvasia, Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon, Barbera and other less-represented bins. Modern technology and numerous awards given to these wines are the guarantee for their quality. The grape vine has been cultivated in the area of Vipava since the time of ancient Romans. Some sources state that the Roman writer Pliny the Elder describes the noble wine of Vipava in his work. At that time, an important traffic vein from Italy to Pannonia led through the Vipava valley. In the middle ages, Morelli writes about the act of the County of Gorica to protect the wine of Vipava in Carinthia and other Austrian countries, so that Italian wine would not be sold under that name. The development of viticulture Carniola described by Janez Vajkard Valvasor in the 17 th century, in his book The Glory of the Duchy of Carniola.



DAY 4, Dubrovnik - Zagreb - LjubljanaBreakfast. Flight Dubrovnik - Zagreb. Lunch. Short sightseeing of Zagreb and going to Ljubljana. Dinner. Overnight.

DAY 5, Ljubljana - Sežana - Vipava - Goriška brda - Ljubljana Breakfast. Starting our trip to Sežana. First stop at Winery Vinakras. Whithin centuries Karst people wanted to produce good grapes that they had to adapt. They had to be standing against the bora wind and to collect every drop of water during the days of draught. A special kind of grape is the Vitovska which protects itself from water loss thanks to strong skin. These grapes have been picked in the end of September and on Easter, as it was exposed to the bora. The grapes dried slow and remained healthy. They lost 90% of their weight and maintained only the best. A testimony, that the Vita 2010. is something special is the very way it pours into a glass. It is thick and sounds deep during pouring. It is wonderful to observe its bright orange shades.

pouring. It is wonderful to observe its bright orange shades. They remind us of sunny autumn days, like the colour of the days of a good grape harvest. As it encounters the glass, we smell dried apricots, fig marmalade and white rum. It is an even greater pleasure to taste it. Thickness and strength warm the taste buds. It has a gentle, creamy and mature effect. The dry grape skins have left it freshness and pleasant tannins, which make the taste so soft and harmonic. Vita is a good match for classic apple pie which can be spiced with a bit of honey.



The most thorough description of grape growing in the Vipava region has been provided in the middle of the 19 th century by the known countryman of Vipava, the priest Matija Vertovec, the author of the first Slovenian book on grapegrowing and winemaking - Winemaking Slovenians, which was published in 1844. He had approached grapegrowing with a critical, exploratory demeanour and attempted to explain in as understanding terms as possible to simple grapegrowers, to explain how they should cultivate the vineyards in given conditions, to achieve optimal results. His work is considered a lasting contribution to Slovenian culture. Viticulture in the Vipaya valley ascribes great importance to the year 1894, when the winegrowers of Vipava founded the first wine cellar in Slovenia, which was registered as the Vipava Wine Cooperative. The history of this Cooperative is very colourful, as it has survived two world wars and an Italian occupation. In these turbulent times, the Cooperative operated without interruptions.



Last stop is at Winery Bjana, Goriška Brda area. Brda hills, where about six thousand inhabitants arranged houses, grouped in villages, which normally have a church in the heart of them, are slowly descending towards the south to the Friuli plain. To some people, a new horizon opens by a nice warm weather, the sea fertilizes the soil on flysch ground with its pleasant Mediterranean climate. Excellent weather conditions and working hands of the local people, produce countless juicy cherry fruit, peaches, apricots, olives, figs, chestnuts, and finally the grapes that ripen at Saint Martin into sweet wine. Brda is a land imbued with a rich history and interesting events in the present. On the way from village to village, we meet with a rich natural and cultural heritage. Brda is a land of castles and churches, mostly white, at the top of hills, there are almost 30 of them preserved. "Bjana" is the name for our village Biljana in the local dialect. Bjana wines are produced and matured on a family estate in the heart of the Goriška Brda winegrowing district, which lies on Alpine foothills with a strong Mediterranean influence. Our wines mature in the fully restored Chateau Dorišče, home to one of the oldest cellars far and wide. Return to Ljubljana. Dinner. Overnight.

DAY 6, Ljubljana - Bled - Belgrade

Breakfast. Sightseeing of Ljubljana - robba fountain, triple broidge, St. Nicolas cathedral, city square. The tour end with a funicular ride to Ljubljana Castle which departs from the Krekov square. Proceeding our trip to Bled. Lunch. Sightseeing of Bled. With immense natural beauty Bled with its surroundings ranks among the most beautiful alpine resorts renowned for its mild, healing climate and thermal lake water. 

DAY 2, Bled - Postojna - Ljubljana

Breakfast. Starting our trip to Postojna. The World Famous Postojna Caves are simply awe-inspiring having formed over thousands of years. Today thousands of tourists of all ages flock to the caves annually to marvel at this Karst phenomenon. Upon arrival, buy a ticket from the ticket booth and then walk up to the main entrance and wait in a small enclosure before being guided towards the train platform. The electric train whisks you a few kilometers into the system before you alight in the hall of the Great Mountain. Then groups are formed according to the language and your guide takes you through the remainder of the caves by foot before you take a short train journey back to the entrance. After sightseeing of Postojna Cave we continue our trip to Ljubljana. Overnight.





DAY 5, Zagreb - Plitvice Lakes

Breakfast. Departure to Plitvice Lakes. After Karlovac town short stop at Open war museum devoted to Homeland war. Short stop at Rastoke – a small village known for its watermills. Driving to Plitvice Lakes. Sightseeing of National park Plitvice Lakes. Wide forest complexes, extraordinary beauty of lakes and falls, rich flora and fauna, fresh air, contrast of autumn colours, forest's paths and wooden bridges are the part of unique unit which was one of the first in the world proclaimed World Natural Heritage by UNESCO in 1979. The water comes from many small rivers and brooks joined together by the cascades and falls. Overnight.



DAY 1, Ljubljana - Bled

Arrival at Ljubljana airport. Transfer to Bled. Sightseeing of Bled. Bled is famous by its Lake Bled and all beautiful scenes around. Lake Bled round trip is around 6 km long so you can walk about 1 hour. Island on Lake Bled is the only island in Slovenia. This island gives Lake Bled some special charm. You can visit the island by rented boats or by organized Pletna boats. It is hard to miss the Bled Castle that is on the rocky wall just above Lake Bled. DAY 4, Ljubljana - Zagreb

Breakfast. Leaving Ljubljana and continuing our trip to Zagreb. Sightseeing tour of Zagreb. Upper Town, St. Mark's church with its multicolored roof and the Cathedral, the Stone Gate, King Tomislav square, Marshal Tito square (Croatian National Theatre, Mimara museum). Free time for shopping and relaxation. Overnight.





DAY 6, Plitvice Lakes - Zadar

Breakfast. Departure to Zadar. Sightseeing of Zadar. It is a town rich with spiritual and material culture. Zadar is centered around the Roman forum with many sacral monuments (St. Donatus church - symbol of Zadar, Cathedral St. Anastasia, St. Krševan church, St. Mary church) and museums. Free time for rest. Overnight.





DAY 8, Split

Breakfast. Full day self sightseeing of the town. Diocletian's palace, included in the UNESCO's list of World Cultural Heritage, Jupiter temple, Cathedral. Split is a cultural and art centre which has preserved its heritage for centuries. It is a town of developed sport and competiting spirit which raised many famous international names: Goran Ivanišević, Toni Kukoč, Dino Rađa... Free time for rest or other activities. Overnight.





DAY 10, Dubrovnik - Montenegro

Breakfast. Starting our trip to Montenegro. Enjoying a breathtaking view of the magnificent scenery of the Bay of Kotor which is often compared to the Norwegian fiords. Driving along the bay, visiting the picturesque local place Perast. We proceed to Kotor, a medieval city classified as UNESCO's World Cultural Heritage surrounded by impressive walls and fortresses and dominated by the Romanesque Cathedral of St. Tryphon. Departure to Budva, short stop for the panoramic view of St. Stefan connected to the mainland by a bridge, once used to be a fisherman village, converted today into a deluxe town-hotel. Orientation visit of Budva's picturesque old town laying on the small peninsula. Time for leisure: for swimming or exploring numerous galleries, boutisques and cafes... Return to Dubrovnik. Overnight.



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DAY 7, Zadar - Šibenik - Trogir - Split

Breakfast. Departure to Šibenik, sightseeing of town cathedral St. Jakov dating from 15 th century. We recommend lunch in a unique Dalmatian village. Proceeding to Trogir. Trogir is a fortified medieval town listed in the UNESCO's World Heritage. Explore the Cathedral of St. Lawrence with famous main Radovan's portal at the entrance, the most significant Romanesque piece of art in Dalmatia, the town Loggia and the Benedictine Monastery. Setting-off to Split. Overnight.



DAY 9, Split - Dubrovnik

Breakfast. Driving along the coast. Short stop in the popular summer town Makarska. Proceeding to Ston. Ston was a major fort of the Ragusan Republic whose defensive walls were regarded as a notable feat of medieval architecture. The town's inner wall measures 890 metres in length, while the Great Wall outside the town has a circumference of 5 km. The walls extend to Mali Ston, a smaller town on the northern side of the Pelješac isthmus and the end of the Bay of Mali Ston, notable for its mariculture. Ston is also known for its saltworks which were run by the Republic of Ragusa and the Ottoman Empire. Setting-off to Dubrovnik. Free time for rest or other activities. Overnight.



DAY 11, Dubrovnik

Breakfast. Full day sightseeing. Pile Gate, with visit of the Onofrio's fountain, Francisan Monastery with the Old Pharmacy, Dominican monastery, Church of St. Blaise - the city's patron saint, Rector's Palace and the Cathedral. Ston is also known for its salt-works which were run by the Republic of Ragusa and the Ottoman Empire. We highly recommend lunch at famous restaurants where you can try best oysters in this part of world. Continue to Dubrovnik. Accommodation at hotel 4*. Free time for rest. Overnight.







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DAY 4, Dubrovnik locco

Breakfast. Sightseeing of Dubrovnik. Having visited Dubrovnik, the Irish writer George Bernard Shaw wrote: "Those who search for paradise on earth should come and see Dubrovnik". Unique for its impressive medieval forts, churches, monuments and palaces, Dubrovnik is often called the pearl of the Adriatic. More than a thousand-year old history of Dubrovnik made it a cultural centre of Europe. Initially small the а community, flourished in no time and became the seat of the independent Dubrovnik Republic. The Republic mastered the art of seafaring and created a fleet on the South Adriatic which could be compared to the one owned by Venice in the north. History is present in the entire city, which is both a museum and a picturesque stage where cultural heritage and contemporary life meet. All houses and monuments have a unique value. The Old City is encompassed by medieval walls, which have been preserved in their original form and opened for visitors as Dubrovnik's major attraction. In 1979. the City was included in UNESCO World Heritage Site list. Free time for rest. Afternoon visit Cavtat and short sightseeing. Highly recommend of dinner at famous restaurant Galija. Here you can enjoy at the best seafood in the area. Return to hotel. Overnight.
